### CRITERIA FOR VERIFICATION OF NON-POLISH EXPERTS<sup>1</sup>

- The candidate for a scientific and industrial (S&I) expert must demonstrate that the necessary conditions and at least two additional conditions are met.
- The candidate for a financial expert must demonstrate that the necessary conditions are met.

# 1. Scientific and industrial expert (disciplinary)

# 1.1. Necessary conditions

- 1.1.1. The candidate expert shall hold a minimum of a Master's degree or higher in the field they are applying to assess in.
- 1.1.2. The candidate expert shall have at least three years of professional experience (irrespective of the form of employment) documented within the last five years in a position related to research, development or implementation.

#### 1.2. Additional conditions

- 1.2.1. The candidate has obtained at least a doctoral degree in a relevant field.
- 1.2.2. Participation in the implementation and commercialisation of R&D results regarding innovative products or processes.
- 1.2.3. The candidate's name is on the list of appraisers or court experts.
- 1.2.4. The expert candidate has a minimum of 1 scientific publication indexed in Web of Science, Scopus or ERIH PLUS in the last 3 years.
- 1.2.5. The candidate expert has been involved in research and development projects as at least a member of the key research staff.
- 1.2.6. Obtaining patents as an applicant or creator.

# 2. Financial expert

## 2.1. Necessary conditions

- 2.1.1. The expert candidate shall hold a minimum of a Master's degree and have the competences to assess the financial aspects of project applications.
- 2.1.2. Within the last 5 years, the candidate expert shall remain in the possession of proven professional experience including at least 3 years (irrespective of the form of employment) in the field of accounting or financial analysis of companies, to the extent allowing them to assess the viability of innovation projects or the financial standing of companies.
